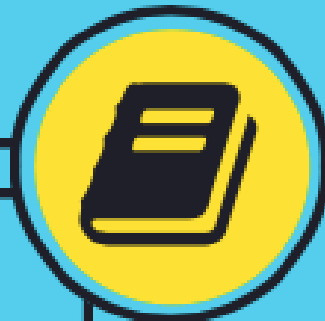

HOW TO GO TO SCHOOL AND TAKE CLASSES FOR FREE

TAKE FORMULA FUNDED CLASSES



Due to a change in Texas law, Tuition and Fee Waiver Letters can now only be used for courses that receive "formula funding". This law should not affect your eligibility to use your Waiver for most classes; however if you are planning to enroll in military classes, study skills classes, GRE or other test prep classes, some adult continuing education classes or remedial education classes, you should talk to your school's registrar to make sure they are formula funded.
